- New trends and future developments in energy governance
- Low-carbon energy technologies and law
- From production to end use: law across different segments of the energy value chain
- Conflicts and conflict resolution in the energy sector

We welcome submissions focused on the overall theme of the conference, as well as on any other topics relevant to energy law.

We invite abstract submissions for presentations by 30 November 2025.

Guidelines for abstracts:

- Abstracts must be written in English, complete with the presentation title, name, institutional affiliation and contact details of the author(s).
- Abstracts should be 200–300 words long.
- Abstracts should contain the aim of the paper, main points, and a brief conclusion. Abstracts should not contain footnotes, tables or graphs.
- Abstracts should be submitted to energytransitions.conference@uef.fi
