

Number of enterprises and operational information by industry and size 2008-2022



- 2009
- May September
- Small boats & jigging
- Strict temporal and spatial limits
- Around 2% of TAC

Regional Quotas

- **2003**
- 5- 8000t/ year
- Around 45 villages apply
- Max of 300t CFE/ village




Coastal Fisheries

- Increased landing during summer
- Does not attract newcomers
- No year-round processing
- Olympic fishing
- Regional (in-)justice
- Very unreliable

Regional Quotas


- Distributional (in-) justice
- Used for tourism activities
- Tension among fisher





Number of boats

- Decreasing number of vessels (loss of 300 in past 20 years)
- Trawlers from 73 to 42
- One exception: undecked vessels in Westfjords: from 151 to 236

Socio-Economic stressor

Lack of substantial funding Outmigration & fluctuation Mono-dependency on single industry Over-embeddedness High costs (e.g. transportation)

COMMUNITY RESILIENCE

... is the ability of a community to cope and adjust to stresses caused by social, political, and environmental change and to engage community resources to overcome adversity and take advantage of opportunities in response to change (Amundsen, 2013)




