Environmental Collaboration and Conflict Resolution (ECCR)

Dates: August 8-12, 2022

Venue: University of Eastern Finland, Joensuu campus

Description of the course:

The course aims to understand environmental collaboration concepts and conflict resolution strategies. The course introduces theoretical and analytical frameworks of environmental collaboration and conflicts in the field of natural resource management, land use and nature conservation. The course includes the examination of real-world conflict cases, exercises and the development of collaboration, mediation and consensus-building skills. The course takes place as an in-person event. Classwork is complemented by a field excursion. Completion of the course results in 5 ECTS credits.
